

HUDSON RAIDER SHOOTERS VICTORIOUS IN BLACK RIVER FALLS TOURNAMENT

The Hudson Raiders Shooting Team brought home the hardware this weekend after shooting in the Black River Falls Invitational tournament which consisted of 100 rounds of trapshooting and 100 rounds of sporting clays.

The Raiders trapshooting varsity squad consisting of Alexander Giebler, Cody Cicha, Ben Diethert, Jordan Persinger and Nathan Madison and the JV squad consisting of Brandon Armstrong, Caitlin Cravens, Garrett Wood, Trevor Cochrane and Dan Lawton brought home first place team medals for breaking 465/500 and 437/500 birds, respectively. Giebler, Cicha, Diethert, Madison, Armstrong, Cravens and Wood each posted a perfect score (25/25) in one round. The Intermediate Division (Advanced and Entry) squad consisting of Claire Diethert, Holden Stanek, Brady Kern, Benjamin Forcier and Jackson Melloy, earned second place by breaking 389/500 birds in trap.

In the sporting clays event, the Raider's varsity squad consisting of Melloy, Giebler and Cicha were awarded first place medals for breaking 260/300. The JV squad consisting of Armstrong, Cravens and Wood brought home 2nd place honors by breaking 208/300 targets.

Individual sporting clays medals were also awarded to Melloy (1st place - Varsity) for breaking 92/100, Armstrong (1st - JV) for breaking 75/100, Cravens (1st place - Ladies JV) for breaking 67/100, Giebler (3rd place - Varsity) for breaking 86/100 and Riley Hammer (3rd - Ladies Varsity) for breaking 62/100.

Individual trapshooting medals were earned by Giebler (1st - Varsity) with 95/100, Cicha (2nd - Varsity) with 94/100, Ben Diethert (3rd - Varsity) with 92/100, Hammer (2nd - Ladies Varsity) with 78/100, Armstrong (2nd - JV) with 93/100, Cravens (2nd - Ladies JV) with 92/100, Claire Diethert (1st - Ladies Intermediate) with 87/100 and Lauren Kern (3rd - Ladies Intermediate) with 65/100.
